Narrative provided by contestant:

6 out of 10 high school bullies will have a felony record by the time they are 24 years old.

The suspension rate in most schools has doubled over the last decade for Blacks and those students experiencing disabilities or poverty.

These are examples of “gaps” present in education. They exemplify how the needs of many students are unmet by public schools. They reflect negative long-term impacts within the educational experience.

With Respect focuses on improving the educational experience, meeting the needs of all students, and closing gaps by creating and placing tools in the hands of students, educators, and communities. It targets anti-bullying, cultural competence, and conflict negotiation.

\$20,000.00 invested into **With Respect** would catapult the impact of our projects:

- **Teach Like Their Lives Depend On It (TLLD)**; an online professional development program providing tools, strategies, and self-reflection to improve classroom management, instruction, discipline, and relationships.
- **"Sampson Says"** book series; providing social stories for students PK-12 to gain and reinforce the “kid-skills” embedded in TLLD.
- **K2K**; A Kid2Kid Curriculum preparing high school youth as trainers of their younger peers. Focus is anti-bullying, cyber-safety, and positive school culture.

The investment would provide universal benefit, but most exciting is the opportunity to expand the K2K pilot.

The current small group pilot from Kitsap Youth in Action, an AmeriCorp program, could be expanded to include high schools across the Kitsap Peninsula.

That’s what it would mean: Increased impact of life changing opportunities for the schools, children and families in our community.
